1 REGISTRATION

- 1.1 The Dulux London Revolution ("Event") consists of a cycling event (of up to two stages) circumnavigating London scheduled to take place on 25th and 26th September 2021 and is organised by Threshold Sports Ltd ("Threshold") and shall be referred to as the "The Dulux London Revolution" or such other title as Threshold may advise.
- 1.2 Only persons aged 16 years or above as at 25th September 2021 may register for the Event. Persons under the age of 18 years (but over 16 years of age) must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. If the nominated parent or guardian cancels their entry before the Event, withdraws or is disqualified during the Event, the Participant under the age of 18 will also be unable to continue.
- 1.3 Applicants must complete and submit the online registration form ("Online Registration Form") which can be found at www.cycle.london-revolution.com (the "Event Website"), and pay the Entry Fee (the "Entry Fee") and the booking fee between £1.50 £4.50 per place (the "Booking Fee").
- 1.4 All successful applicants (hereinafter referred to as "Participants") will be notified by way of an email confirmation that they have been allocated a place to take part in the Event ("Online Confirmation").
- 1.5 Places in the Event are strictly limited and therefore applications are subject to availability. Subject to Clauses 1.2 to 1.4 (inclusive) above, Threshold will consider applications on a first come, first served basis by eligible Participants (which Threshold shall determine in its absolute discretion) and otherwise in accordance with these Rules and Regulations ("Rules and Regulations").
- 1.6 The relevant date for registrations shall be the date the Participant receives the Online Confirmation. Threshold is not responsible for technical, hardware or software failures of any kind, lost or unavailable network connections, or failed, incomplete, garbled or delayed computer/Internet transmissions or other errors or malfunctions of any kind which may prevent receipt by Threshold of an Online Registration Form or receipt by an applicant of an Online Confirmation. For the avoidance of doubt, if, for any reason whatsoever, an applicant does not receive an Online Confirmation, said applicant shall not be considered to be a Participant and Threshold shall not be responsible for the applicant's failed application.
- 1.7 All Online Registration Forms must be received by Threshold on or before midnight on Sunday 19th September 2021 ("Entry Deadline"). Any Online Registration received by Threshold after the Entry Deadline will not be accepted. This deadline is subject to change if the Event entries are full prior to the above date, and in accordance with Clause 1.5. Threshold reserves the right to close the Online Registration Form at any point.

- 2.1 Subject to the other provisions of Section 1, submission of the Online Registration Form, payment of the Entry Fee and the Booking Fee, and receipt of the Online Confirmation shall (together) entitle the Participant to participate in the Event.
- 2.2 Threshold reserve the right to change the dates that the Entry Fee increases.
- 2.3 The Event is personal to the Participant accepting these Rules and Regulations, and the Participant undertakes and agrees (i) only to participate in the Event wearing the number assigned to his/her registration, (ii) not to authorise or permit any third party to use his/her Participant number for the Event and (iii) not to sell, transfer or give any other person the right to participate in the Event and/or use the Participant's number, with the exception of compliance with Clause 3.2.
- 2.4 If at any time it is discovered that any Participant should have been ineligible to participate in the Event or if participation in the Event should have been refused for any reason whatsoever, Threshold reserves the right to disqualify such Participant from/refuse such Participant entry to the Event. Further, Threshold reserves the right to reject at any time any Online Registration Form which it believes to be fraudulent, or to disqualify at any time any Participant it believes not to have fully complied with these Rules and Regulations from participant as a result of any such disqualification or refusal. It is the Participant's responsibility to ensure full compliance with these Rules and Regulations.
- 2.5 If any provision in these Rules and Regulations, whether in full or in part, is held to be invalid or unenforceable, all other remaining provisions (in full or in part) shall continue to be valid and enforceable.
- 2.6 These Rules and Regulations (and any documents referred to herein) constitute the entire agreement and understanding of the parties and supersede any previous agreement between the parties relating to the Event. Nothing in these conditions shall constitute or be deemed to constitute a partnership between the parties. These Rules and Regulations shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of England and Wales and any dispute arising hereunder shall be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts.

3 CANCELLATION OPTIONS

- 3.1 Any Participant intending to cancel their place in the Event shall inform Threshold as soon as reasonably practicable ("Cancellation Notification").
 - 3.1.1 Threshold operates a seven (7) day cooling off period. Accordingly, the Participant is entitled to cancel his/her Entry to participate, provided Threshold receives written notice of cancellation within seven (7) days of payment of the Entry Fee. During this 7-day period, the Participant is able to cancel his/her entry and receive a full refund of the Entry Fee by emailing info@london-revolution.com. The notice must be received before the end of the seven (7) day cooling off period. The Booking Fee is non-refundable.
 - 3.1.2 Thereafter, the Entry Fee is non-refundable with the exception of circumstances as outlined in Clauses 3.2 and 4.5.
 - 3.1.3 Additional extras purchased that are managed by Threshold Sports such as merchandise, parking permits and shuttle passes will be refunded in full
 - 3.1.4 Additional extras purchased that are managed by 3rd parties such as iTabs and registration insurance are subject to the individual parties' terms and conditions

- 3.1.5 If the Participant is a charity entry, any donations raised will not be refunded.
- 3.2 PARTICIPANT TRANSFER

- 3.2.1 A Participant can transfer their entry to another individual ("Participant Transfer") if notice is given to Threshold. Participants who transfer their Entry can be eligible for a full refund of all Entry Fees paid (minus the Booking Fee and the Administration Fee) subject to Clauses 3.2.1 3.2.7.
- 3.2.2 Notice of a Participant Transfer must be done via the Participant's 'MyEvents' Portal. The 'MyEvents' Portal is an *Active Networks* system, which allows the Participant to manage his/her registration details for the Event.
 - Click Transfer registration to another athlete
 - Enter recipient email address in email address field
 - Enter recipient email address in Confirm email address field and click Submit
 - Confirmation email sent to Outgoing Participant and new Participant to verify that the transfer process has been initiated.
- 3.2.3 Participant Transfers can only take place if the new Participant wishes to take the same Event Package
- 3.2.4 The most current Entry Fee and Booking Fee is applied at checkout when the new Participant accepts the transfer by clicking the link within the confirmation email detailed in 3.2.2. This Entry Fee could be higher than that for the original Participant
- 3.2.5 The original Entry Fee is not refunded until the new Participant accepts and completes the transfer process.
- 3.2.6 The Administration Fee will be deducted automatically from the refund as follows:
 - Up until 23:59, 16th May 2021: £0
 - Before 23:59, 22nd August 2021: £25
 - Before 23:59, 19th September 2021: £30
- 3.2.7 Additional extras purchased are not transferred to the incoming Participant and will be refunded to the outgoing Participant in line with 3.1.3-3.1.4
- 3.2.8 Refunds are processed within 5-7 business days.
- 3.2.9 Participants who are deferring their place from 2020 and would like to do a Participant Transfer can do so up until 23:59, 31st December 2020 free of charge. After this time the Administration Fees will apply outlined in 3.2.6. Participants must email info@london-revolution.com to process this.

3.3 PARTICIPANT DEFERRAL

- 3.3.1 A Participant is permitted to defer their entry to the following year (2022 Event) if notice is given to Threshold. Notice of a Participant Deferral must be done via the Participant's 'MyEvents' Portal.
- 3.3.2 The Participant must pay the Administration Fee before the deferral can be confirmed. This is payable via the 'Additional Purchases' section of the MyEvents portal.
- 3.3.3 The deadlines and associated Administration Fee for this are:
 - Up until 23:59, 16th May 2021: £0
 - Before 23:59, 22nd August 2021: £25
 - Before 23:59, 19th September 2021: £30
- 3.3.4 Once the Administration Fee has been processed, within 5 working days, Thresholds will cancel the Participant registration for 2021. Threshold will not refund the Entry Fee, but will send the Participant a free of charge web link to sign up to the Event the following year. The Participant will not need to pay again for the following year.

3.3.5 Additional extras purchased will be refunded in line with 3.1.3-3.1.4

- 3.3.6 If the Participant wishes to change their package, it is the responsibility of the Participant to complete following the steps outlined in Clause 3.4 once they have completed their registration for 2022.
- 3.3.7 The Participant understands that once a deferral has been processed, the Administration Fee is non-refundable under any circumstances.
- 3.3.8 A participant can only defer their entry once. A deferral will not be permitted if the Participant has already deferred previously.
- 3.3.9 If a participant needs to defer due to Covid related reasons, such as being subject to a local lockdown, international quarantine, a positive test or self-isolation requirement, we will waive the Deferral Administration Fee. The participant must notify Threshold via email by the time that registration commences on the live event and provide evidence of the situation.

3.4 EVENT TRANSFER

- 3.4.1 A participant can transfer their entry to to the Dulux London Revolution Trails ("Event Transfer") if notice is given to the Event Organisers.
- 3.4.2 Notice of an Event Transfer must be done via the Participant's "MyEvents" Portal.
 - Click Transfer to another event
 - Select the event and category and complete the form
- 3.4.3 Additional extras purchased will be refunded in line with 3.1.3-3.1.4
- 3.4.4 The deadlines and associated Administration Fees for this are:
 - Before 23:59, 19th September 2021: £25
- 3.4.5 Participants who are deferring their place from 2020 and would like to do an Event Transfer can do so up until 23:59, 31st December 2020 free of charge. After this time the Administration Fees will apply outlined in 3.4.4. Please note that those transferring to a higher priced package are required to pay the increase in fee and those transferring to a lower priced package will not receive a refund for the difference in price. Participants must email info@london-revolution.com to process this.

3.5 PARTICIPANT CHANGE OF PACKAGE

- 3.5.1 A Participant can change their package if notice is given to Threshold.
- 3.5.2 Notice of a participant Package Change must be done via the Participant's "MyEvents" Portal.
 - Click Change category
 - Select the new category complete the form
- 3.5.3 The most current Entry Fee and Booking Fee is applied at checkout.
- 3.5.4 If the Participant is transferring to a package with a decrease in Entry Fee, the Participant will not be refunded the difference in these packages.
- 3.5.5 If the Participant is transferring to a package with an increase in Entry Fee, the difference plus any incremental Booking Fees for making the change must be paid before the Participant can complete the change.
- 3.5.6 If a participant is transferring to a charity package, please call the event hotline as a refund of the difference will be given.

- 3.5.7 The deadline for this is:
 - Before 23:59, 19th September 2021

4 DULUX LONDON REVOLUTION

- 4.1 Subject to Clause 4.4 below, the Event will be held on 25th and 26th September 2021.
- 4.2 The Event is a two day endurance cycling event circumnavigating London. Participants are able to enter the following packages:
 - "All Inclusive Weekender": Ride two days and stay overnight with dinner and breakfast included;
 - "Just Ride": Ride 2 days without overnight provision;
 - "Southern Package": Ride Day One only;
 - "Southern Package including camping": Ride Day One, and stay overnight with dinner and breakfast included;
 - "Northern Package": Ride Day Two only;
 - "Northern Package including camping": Ride Day Two; and stay overnight (on Saturday 25th September, 2021) with dinner and breakfast included;
- 4.3 Participants are able to take part in the Event as part of a team. Participants must enter a team name on their Online Registration Form. Participants are encouraged to complete the route in groups for reasons of safety, although this is not compulsory.
- Threshold reserves the right to change the time, date, route and/or format of the Event, or, in exceptional circumstances, to cancel the Event, in whole or in part, without liability to the Participant. In such cases, Threshold:
 - 4.4.1 will make a reasonable effort to provide notice of the changes/cancellation via email. If email notice is not practicable due to the timescales involved, we will use reasonable alternative methods of notice including text messages;
 - 4.4.2 will have no responsibility or liability for any costs incurred, including any travel or accommodation costs whether existing or additional, as a result of the changes/cancellation; and
 - 4.4.3 undertakes to act with full transparency and fully observe and satisfy its legal obligations to you at all times.
- 4.5 If, due to Covid-19, Threshold change the time, date, route and/or format of the Event, or, in exceptional circumstances, cancel the Event, in whole or in part, the Participant will have the option to receive a full refund of their Entry Fee paid to date, less the Booking Fee.
- Threshold reserves the right to remove any Participant from the Event, either during or before it, due to ill health, or any other reason (at Threshold's discretion) that may render the Participant unfit to safely complete the Event or unable to participate in a manner which fully complies with any applicable government medical or safety instructions, protocols or guidelines. The Participant confirms that he/she will not take part in the Event if he/she is suffering from any contagious illness (to include, but not exclusively, symptoms suggestive of Covid-19 (or similar) infection and diarrhoea or vomiting symptoms) and confirms that he/she will report any illness during the Event, to the Event medical team immediately.
- 4.7 The Participant agrees to complete a Health Screening questionnaire and/or body temperature screen where this is deemed necessary by the Event Organiser or the Event Medical Team.

- 4.8 The Participant agrees to follow all instructions and guidelines issued by the Event Organiser, observe all protocols and adhere to any measures that may be in place at the Event in order to address and help mitigate the risk presented by Covid-19. Such safeguards may include the Participant having to complete a Health Screening questionnaire and/or body temperature screening where this is deemed necessary by the Event Organiser or the Event Medical Team.
- Irrespective of any safeguards that may be put in place by the Event Organiser, Participation in the Event is at the Participant's own risk, including risk to the Participant themselves (in particular with respect to the transmission of Covid-19 or any variant) and any damage caused by/to third parties or third party property. The Participant irrevocably agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and reimburse Threshold from and for any sum, costs or expenses (including legal and professional fees) incurred, payable or paid by Threshold to any person (including the Participant and/or any of the Participant's insurers) in connection with any accident, loss, damage or injury (including death) arising out of the Participant's attendance at and participation in the Event or any part thereof (except where any such injury or death is caused by the negligence of Threshold or any of its employees).
- 4.10 If the Participant becomes ill with Covid-19 related symptoms within 3 weeks of the Event, they agree to inform Threshold so that they can assist with necessary 'tracking and tracing' in line with government policy at the time.
- 4.11 The Participant agrees to be contacted by Threshold after the event should another participant on the Event develop systems of Covid-19 within 3 weeks of the Event.
- 4.12 Without prejudice to Threshold's right to remove any Participant from the Event due to ill health pursuant to Clause 4.6 above, the Participant acknowledges and agrees that:
 - 4.12.1 If he/she is a participant of the "All Inclusive Weekender" or "Southern Package including camping" or "Northern Package including camping" and becomes ill with a non-infectious illness (as determined by the Event medical team) during "Day 1" but wishes to then join "Day 2" or wishes to sleep in the overnnight basecamp, Threshold will, where reasonably practicable and subject to the advice of the Event medical team, transfer him/her to the overnight basecamp. Where such transfer is not reasonably practicable (or where the Event medical team advise against the Participant's continued involvement in the Event), the Participant shall be removed from the Event.
 - 4.12.2 If, however, the Participant becomes ill with an infectious illness (as determined by the Event medical team), the Participant shall be removed from the Event.
- 4.13 A Participant may be disqualified ("Disqualification") from the Event by Threshold if:
 - 4.13.1 the Participant arrives at the pit stop after the designated pit stop cut off time ("Pit Stop Cut Off Time"). The Participant will be responsible for his/ her repatriation according to Clause 4.14; Pit Stop Cut Off Times will be communicated to the Participants via e-mail a minimum of two weeks in advance of the Event;
- 4.14 In the event of a Participant having to leave the Event because of injury, illness, voluntary withdrawal or Disqualification, the Participant will be responsible for all repatriation travel costs and related incurred travel arrangements. This includes repatriation from the overnight basecamp or pit stops to the finish location as a result of voluntary withdrawal or Disqualification. Threshold will not be responsible for transporting the Participant or any belongings of the Participants, including, but not limited to, their bag.
- 4.15 Threshold will endeavour to provide every Participant with a completion time but is not responsible for any electronic timing anomalies.
- 4.16 No drugs, illegal substances, performance enhancing substances or intoxicants of any kind are permitted to be used by any Participant either before or during participation in the Event. Threshold reserves the right to refuse attendance at, or participation in, the Event by any persons found to have consumed or to have in their possession any drugs, illegal substances, performance enhancing substances or intoxicants of any kind.
- 4.17 Threshold reserves the exclusive right and license throughout the world (and Participant hereby grants Threshold such exclusive right and licence) to interview and/or photograph and/or film the Participant at the

Event (and before and after the Event as Threshold may reasonably require) and to the unlimited, worldwide, sub-licensable right to record, film, reproduce and use in all current and future media (including without limitation, print, audio, visual, audio-visual, virtual media, the Internet, mobile telephony and so-called "3-G" technologies, CD-ROM or DVDs) the Participant's name, likeness and image or facsimile image, signature, voice, video and film portrayals and other means of identification of the Participant, and any biographical or other information or data related to the Participant (including times and results), in connection with the production, advertisement, marketing, promotion or sale of Event sponsor products and/or the promotion, marketing or advertisement of Threshold or any Event sponsor or partner.

- 4.18 As a continuing condition of entry each Participant shall ensure that, for the duration of the Event:
 - 4.18.1 safety approved cycle helmets are worn at all times when cycling;
 - 4.18.2 he/she is capable of carrying out basic bike maintenance, including, but not limited to, puncture repairs, whilst on the route;
 - 4.18.3 he/she does not start earlier than the official start time on each day of the Event. He/she will be provided with a start time wave between the hours of 6.00am and 8.30am which will need to be adhered to. Failure to comply with this rule will result in disqualification;
 - 4.18.4 he/she completes each daily stage between the hours of 6.45am (6.00am for the ULTRA) and 5.00pm (9.00pm for the ULTRA), however, Threshold reserves the right to alter the route start and finish times each day in the event of mitigating circumstances e.g. strong head winds;
 - 4.18.5 he/she stays in front of the broomwagon on the route at all times. The broom wagon will depart the start at 9.00am (7.00am for the ULTRA) and follow the rider field at an average speed in line with the pit stop cut off times and the 5.00pm (9.00pm for the ULTRA) route closure. If a Participant falls behind this pace he/she will be collected by the broom wagon and repatriated to the overnight basecamp during Day 1 and may rejoin the Event on Day 2. If picked up by the broom wagon on Day 2 he/shes will be repatriated to the finish line.. Threshold shall have no liability whatsoever to any Participant who fails to remain in front of the broom wagon and refuses to be collected by it and Threshold reserves the right to remove such Participant from the remainder of the Event;
 - 4.18.6 his/her bicycle is roadworthy for the Event and equipped with the relevant insurances and documentation;
 - 4.18.7 he/she understands that his/her bike will be left at his/her own risk when situated in the start, finish, pit stop and overnight basecamp bike racking areas;
 - 4.18.8 he/she does not use a mobile phone whilst cycling;
 - 4.18.9 due to the outdoor nature and endurance aspect of the Event, he/she maintains personal hygiene at all times, and adheres to all hygiene advice provided by Threshold;
 - 4.18.10 he/she does not use a music player with headphones whilst cycling;
 - 4.18.11 he/she does not take food or drink from anyone other than another Participant whilst on the move;
 - 4.18.12 he/she displays the official event numbers provided in advance of the event in the manner indicated during the Event;
 - 4.18.13 he/she does not deviate from the official signed route of the Event;
 - 4.18.14 he/she abides by all Event rules and regulations;
 - 4.18.15 he/she acknowledges that it is his/her responsibility to ensure that he/she has taken out a policy of insurance suitable for his/her participation in the Event. He/she further acknowledges that he/she may be refused entry to, or removed from, the Event should it come to Threshold's attention that no suitable

insurance policy has been secured. Example of suitable insurance cover is outlined below, but not limited to:

- A minimum of £2 million 3rd Party Liability Insurance;
- Travel insurance that covers personal travel plans; and
- Insurance that covers personal belongings, including his/her bike.
- 4.18.16 he/she has working lights attached to their bike;
- 4.18.17 he/she complies with the Highway Code at all times; and
- 4.18.18 he/she obeys traffic officers and authorised marshals at all times; failure to do so will result in disqualification.
- 4.18.19 Should the Participant choose to take part in the Event on an Electrically Assisted Pedal Cycle (e-bike), the Participant must:
 - comply with the government rules in England, Scotland and Wales as to the classification of an ebike and licensing, tax and insurance requirements, as set out here https://www.gov.uk/electric-bike-rules
 - ensure the battery will last the for the duration of the full day as there will not be charging available at pit-stops

5 PARTICIPANT'S WARRANTIES AND UNDERTAKINGS

- 5.1 The Participant acknowledges that participation in the Event is not possible without validly entering into this agreement on these Rules and Regulations and agrees to be bound by these Rules and Regulations.
- 5.2 The Participant agrees at all times during the Event to abide by the reasonable instructions and guidelines of Threshold's staff, nominated representatives, and contractors and to behave appropriately at all times on the route and in the overnight basecamp. Participants acknowledge and agree that Threshold will organise and run the Event and will have sole authority and be the final arbiter on all decisions relating to the following aspects of the Event: health and safety, logistical operations, participation, organisation and Rules and Regulations.
- 5.3 The Participant understands the endurance demands of the Event and commits to preparing to take part in the Event by:
 - 5.3.1 complying with the Event training advice as issued by Threshold;
 - 5.3.2 consistently completing long distance rides (min. 73miles) before the Event;
 - 5.3.3 undertaking training within a group in busy road conditions (e.g. roundabouts, major junctions) in order to feel confident out on the road;
 - 5.3.4 completing a medical and dietary form as part of the registration process; and
 - 5.3.5 providing emergency contact details of someone who is not also participating in the event.
- 5.4 The Participant acknowledges that participation in the Event involves inherent risks of accidents and injury.
- The Participant acknowledges that he/she is personally responsible for his/her own belongings during the Event, and that he/she must collect any personal lost items from lost property before he/she leaves the Event.
- 5.6 Participation in the Event is at the Participant's own risk. The Participant irrevocably agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and reimburse Threshold from and for any sum, costs or expenses (including legal and professional

fees) incurred, payable or paid by Threshold to any person (including the Participant and/or any of the Participant's insurers) in connection with any accident, loss, damage or injury (including death) arising out of the Participant's attendance at and participation in the Event or any part thereof (except where any such injury or death is caused by the negligence of Threshold or any of its employees).

- 5.7 The Participant confirms without reservation that he/she is in a good physical condition to participate in the Event, that he/she understands the endurance demands of the Event, and will not arrive at the Event in ill health or unfit to take part.
- The Participant confirms that he/she will not publish or post on any website or other media operated by Threshold or related to the Event any text, statement, photograph, image or other material which is obscene, blasphemous, defamatory, infringes the intellectual property or other legal rights of any third party or is otherwise unlawful, offensive or inappropriate. Threshold will have the right to remove any material at its discretion and take appropriate legal action against any person found to be or alleged to be in breach of this Clause 5.8.
- 5.9 The Participant's journeys to and from the start and finish lines of the Event each day shall be entirely at the Participant 's own risk and cost. Threshold will not be responsible for transporting the Participant or any belongings of the Participant, including, but not limited to, their bag.

6 CHARITY PLACES & FUNDRAISING DECLARATION

- 6.1 If taking part as a charity place, you are required to fundraise a minimum of £450 or the figure agreed by your charity.
- You are required to reach at least 50% of your target at least 6 weeks prior to the "event" (13th August 2021). If registering after 13th August 2021, you must raise 50% of your target by 19th September 2021. Failure to do this can result in your removal from the "event".
- 6.3 You are required to reach your full fundraising target no later than 4 weeks after the "event".
- 6.4 If you wish to transfer from a charity place to a public place, you must pay the increase in Entry Fee.
- 6.5 If you wish to transfer from a public place to a charity place, you will be refunded the difference in Entry Fee for this place. However, you will be subject to the above fundraising declarations outlined in 6.1, 6.2 and 6.3.
- 6.6 If you wish to cancel your place, please refer to Section 3 above for your cancellation options. All Clauses outlined in Section 3 are applicable to those taking part as a charity place.
- 6.7 If taking part as a charity place and fundraising for a non partner charity, you must first receive confirmation from both Threshold Sports and your chosen charity before you begin to fundraise.
- 6.8 If taking part as a charity place, you are opting in to sharing your personal data with your chosen charity and agreeing to be contacted by your charity in relation to your participation in the "event". This is of the understanding that your chosen charity will not share your personal data with any third party for marketing purposes.
